### ***Empress of Ireland – New Date Added for 2010***

Kevin McMurray, author of *Deep Descent* which addresses the Andria Doria, also wrote *Dark Descent* which provides an excellent account of diving the Empress of Ireland and a good historical view of the wreck that is unparalleled in terms of human tragedy. If you have not had the opportunity to read this book, which is also available as an audio book, it's well worthwhile.

Lake Huron offers not only unbelievable visibility but also many of the best preserved wrecks on the planet!! You have to love that fresh water and it's right in our own backyard! We are heading there in July to dive the wrecks in the 160-210 foot range.



These dives are ideal for the entry level trimix diver or extended range diver. In fact, why not take your course there! There are only 2 spots left and they won't last long.

### ***Gunilda and Judge Hart***

The Gunilda may not be the largest wreck in the world but it has been described as the best preserved wreck in the world. Once, the flagship of the New York Yacht Club, this 195 foot long luxury yacht is truly a site to behold. Resting in 270 ffw in northern Lake Superior, this is an outstanding dive trip for the advanced trimix diver. Our second September trip is full but there is availability on the first trip.



While in the area we always try to get out to the Judge Hart which is a very well preserved freighter in 200 ffw. Together the Gunilda and Judge Hart are two dive sites that are going to put a smile on any technical divers face.

### ***Truk Lagoon and Palau 2011 – Only a Few Spots Left***



With the 2010 trip full there is lots of interest in the 2011 trip. You will visit Guam, dive a week in Truk Lagoon from the Odyssey, dive another week in Palau while enjoying luxurious accommodations and then finish off in Hawaii before returning to Los Angeles.
